And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar.

- ⁷ Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech." ⁸ So the Lord dispersed them from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city.

⁹ Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth. And from there the Lord dispersed them over the face of all the earth.



Why is the understanding of Tongues important?

Acts 2 is a REVERSAL of Gen 11

- In Genesis, The Holy Spirit goal was to mixed their Language to thwart self-glorification
- In Acts, The Holy Spirit goal is to foster unity and understanding in order to bring glory to God
