For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

The Sin of Unbelief

Unbelief is to not trust in or believe, or to doubt the promises of God.

It is at times a bizarre paradoxical place of both belief and unbelief in which the saint acknowledges that God's word is true, but struggles or lacks the spiritual maturity to trust or live in its reality.

Mark 9:17-27

"And someone from the crowd answered him, Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a spirit that makes him mute. And whenever it seizes him, it throws him down, and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid. So I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able.' And he answered them,



'O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me.' And they brought the boy to him. And when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, 'How long has this been happening to him?' And he said, 'From childhood.



And it has often east him into fire and into water, to destroy him. But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us.' And Jesus said to him, "If you can"! All things are possible for one who believes.' Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, 'I believe; help my unbelief!' And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it,



You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him and never enter him again.' And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, 'He is dead.' But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose."



- 1. Annoyance: We become annoyed with godly counsel and the Word of God begins to sound like cliché.
- 2. Anger: We become angry with those who love us and hold us accountable.
- 3. Apathy: We become apathetic towards our spiritual life as well as life in the church.
- 4. Avoidance: We begin to avoid fellowship.
- 5. Apostasy: We become apostate or backslidden. At this point we are either under church discipline or we leave on our own.
