- 2. Ecclesial = MINISTERS and SERVANTS



Five Clear Implications for Church Membership

- 1. The assumption of Church Discipline
  - MATTHEW 18:15-17

<sup>15</sup> "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. <sup>16</sup> But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. <sup>17</sup> If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.



Five Clear Implications for Church Membership

- 2. The assumption of Excommunication
  - 1 CORINTHIANS 5:12-13

<sup>12</sup> For what have I to do with judging outsiders? Is it not those inside the church whom you are to judge? <sup>13</sup> God judges those outside. "Purge the evil person from among you."

- The assumption of submission by Christians to their leaders, elders, or pastors
  - HEBEWS 13:17
    - <sup>17</sup> Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you.

- 4. The assumption of the Elders' care for the Flock
  - ACTS 20:28

<sup>28</sup> Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.

## MACC's Covenants - Discipleship and MACC Group Covenants

MACC Groups Structure What are MACC groups? MACC groups are local, urban missional communities of people that gather weekly to share life and truth, love

MACC Groups are grounded in Four Principles and shaped by Four Practices.

### The Four Practices

SHARE → truth and life

PRAY for one another and the City

people and culture ENGAGE → LOVE

### The Four Principles:

We all are broken:

We are all more broken than we want to admit, and God is more holy than we comprehend.

In Jesus we are more forgiven and accepted than we can imagine, and God is more delighted in us that we moderateed

God and one another, and engage the social and spiritual needs of our Community. They are family/people-

based and inter-generational ethnic, a place where the church can be the church to one another and to the

### We all need one another:

We need each other to share our struggles and joys in following Jesus.

The gospel offers the hope of justice, the clarity of truth, the comfort of grace, and joy of Jesus to a broken

MACC Groups begin with a two-hour weekly commitment. We gather with no more than four families. During this time we share a meal together, communion and our lives. Facilitated by a leader, our time together will include prayer, discussing the weekly message and/or book of the Bible.

The dinner responsibility is rotated weekly. The expectation is that these groups would be loxing, simple, real, biblical, and missional. Once every four weeks, MACC Groups serve their local communities through MACC

### The Focus Of Our Discussion

God- What does this text reveal to me about God? (His Character). Community- What does this text reveal about me and us as a group? (His People). Missional- What does this text reveal about our context as missionaries? (His Mission).

The expectation is that each family is willing to lead a MACC Group when appropriate. This means either leaving your current group to start another or continuing with that group while starting another. This decision is jointly based on the desire of your group and discemment of the families.

### The MACC Discipleship Covenant

A disciple is one who loves God, our Lord Jesus Christ, with all his heart, soul and mind, and tries to become more and more like him through a life of faith and

Make sense of God's word and God's world. We want to become people who learn how to study and apply the word of God to their lives and then teach others how to study the word and apply it to their lives.

### Relationship

Make a practice of being with those I am in a group with and those that I will eventually lead. Jesus shows how important the developing of the relationship is to growing a disciple in Christ. The people of MACC should know they are loved not only by Christ but also by their discipler.

Following Jesus' model and command of ministry that include gospel. proclamation, and the serving of others, namely, the poor, and marginalized.


