STRUCTURE

A covenant is an arrangement between two parties involving mutual obligations; especially the arrangement that established the relationship between God and his people, expressed in grace first with Israel and then with the church.

STRUCTURE OF A COVENANT

- I. Preamble: which identifies the giver and recipients of the covenant ("the Lord your God," 20:2)
- Prologue: a reminder of the relationship of the suzerain to the people ("who brought you out of Egypt," 20:2)
- 3. Stipulations: various laws/obligations on the part of the people (20:3–23:19; 25:1–31:18)

 List of witnesses to the covenant ["I am Yahweh," Exod 29:46; 31:13; Lev 11:44]

STRUCTURE OF A COVENANT

 Document clause: providing for writing down of the covenant so that periodic reading and relearning of the covenant can take place as time goes by (see Exod 24:4, 7, 12)
Sanctions: blessings and curses as incentives for obedience (see Exod 20:5–6,12, 24; 23:20–31; cf. Lev 26:3–14 [blessings]; 26:14–39 [curses]; 26:40–45 [restoration blessings]).
