• Romans 8:18: For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory

• Spurgeon says "The Greek word for looking is a much fuller word than we can find in the English language. It has a preposition in it that turns the look away from everything else."



VIRTUAL REALITY

- Completely sealed off from existing world to engage in new reality
- Eyes directed toward only one thing
- React according to new norm Mental, physical, emotional

Authors use words to tell stories, engage others in new ideas or frames of reference.
